Re: CP22-396 Ryan Road Concrete Pavement Improvements- 14 Mile Road to Metropolitan Parkway

Dear Resident:

Sterling Heights City Council has approved concrete repairs on Ryan Road between 14 Mile Road and Metropolitan Parkway by DiLisio Construction. Construction is tentatively set to begin between 14 Mile Road and 15 Mile Road on or about April 27, 2022 (weather permitting). Traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction, and left turns will periodically be restricted. Traffic delays should be expected during these necessary repairs. The project is expected to be completed at the end of July 2022.

The project will be completed in four phases (see the back side for more info). Access to all businesses and residential homes on Ryan Road will remain open to traffic during construction. Full access to Grissom Middle School driveways will be maintained until the end of the 2021/2022 school year. If at any time that changes, you will receive written notice at least 24 hours in advance from City personnel.

Phase 1 - 14 Mile to 15 Mile: Starting on or about May 2, the outer (curb) lanes of Ryan road will be closed to traffic for repairs.

Phase 2 - 14 Mile to 15 Mile: The inner three lanes will be closed for repairs. Left turns will be restricted during this phase to protect workers and the new concrete.

Phase 3 - 15 Mile to Metro Parkway: The outer (curb) lanes of Ryan road between 15 Mile Road and Metro Parkway will be closed to traffic for repairs.

Phase 4 - 15 Mile to Metro Parkway: The inner three lanes will be closed for repairs. Left turns will be restricted during this phase to protect workers and the new concrete.

During the project, please place your trash in approved trash/yard waste bags only (avoid trash cans), and it will be picked up by the contractor or GFL on your normal refuse collection day. Some mailboxes may need to be temporarily relocated to allow postal service access. If your mailbox needs to be relocated, City personnel will contact you with additional instructions.
