**CONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

Re: 2020 Joint Sealing Program  
 City Project No. 20-372

Dear Resident,

The City of Sterling Heights has awarded a contract to Michigan Joint Sealing, Inc. to seal pavement cracks and joints on 32 City streets this year, providing over 7 miles of roadway treatment. Joint sealing is a cost effective way to preserve and prolong the overall life of pavement. The project will begin this fall and be completed in approximately 6 weeks.

During the sealing operation, the contractor will remove the old joint sealant out of the pavement joints, route any existing pavement cracks, and apply new joint sealant. Prior to applying the new sealant, the contractor will clean out the pavement cracks and joints using a compressed air system. Minor dust and debris will be created during the cleaning process and will be swept up at the end of the day. The process will last approximately 3-5 days per street (weather permitting) and access to all driveways will be maintained. You will be asked to remove any parked cars from the street once the work on your street begins.

This road improvement project was made possible as a direct result of the voter-approved Safe Street Millage in November 2019.
